## Super Saying

We now have a signed contract with Hara Arena for this year's Fall Train Show. As usual, we'll have the East Hall for vendors, the Ball Arena for layouts and clinics, and the room for the Scout Merit Badge class. In the East Hall we'll also have the Scenic Ridge layout we're building for the raffle.

At a special Board of Governors meeting on August 4<sup>th</sup> we aired concerns that the train show attendance and vendor participation might be reduced because of three other train shows near ours this fall. We discussed whether to reduce the amount of Hara Arena we rent, to save money. The board decided to maintain the current size, believing that one purpose of our show is to promote the hobby. There was also some concern that reducing the size of the show this year might reduce attendance in future years.

The Scenic Ridge layout for the show raffle is almost finished. We'll leave some details for the new owners to install, but the layout will be essentially complete well before show time. Dick Strous has been emailing photos he's taken. I'll bring prints to the September meeting.

The Chesapeake & Ohio Historical Society held its annual conference and Modeler's Weekend July 23-26, in Charlottesville, VA. These are a bit like a small NMRA regional convention, but focused on the C&O. There were slightly over a hundred people there. The days and evenings were filled with modeling clinics, slide shows about C&O equipment, and a tour along what used to be the C&O Mountain Subdivision, now operated by CSX. If you're modeling a specific railroad that has an active Historical

Society, you might want to consider becoming participating. It can be a lot of fun.

In the model railroad press there has been mention from time to time about model airplane accessories that are useful in model railroad layouts. One such device that appears to have some potential is the *servo*, used to control the elevator and other moving parts of a model airplane. Some servos cost about the same as a stall-motor switch machine, and may be more versatile. For example, a servo could ponderously move a semaphore blade to any position, provided one can find a simple way to control the servo. A few months ago I bought a Futaba S3004 servo for experimentation, and last week finally got around to building a control circuit for it. The circuit has a knob you turn to set the servo shaft angle wherever you like. That's OK for experimentation, but what we need to control a semaphore or a crossing gate, or the like, is a servo driver that responds to track detector signals, not a knob. A \$1.98 microprocessor could do the job, and I've ordered a couple. Stay tuned. If you'd like to help, call me.
