

Let's get rolling...

Upgrading tools

I don't know about you but I use my air brush probably as much as any tool in the shop. While I don't hold myself out as any kind of an artist I usually can get the paint to come out the right end. It took a while to master it to the point where I can get results I'm proud of but like many other tools I had to do a lot of learning along the way. Years ago after reading about the wonders of air brush painting I took the plunge and bought one that was in the range of equipment to do a modeler's job. One thing I needed then was a quiet source of propellant because running a noisy air compressor was OUT with my family sleeping upstairs when I did a lot of my hobby work in the night time. I opted for a CO2 bottle and regulator. It was silent and it served me fine for over forty years. I would get it filled with a charge of CO2 about once a year from one of the fire extinguisher companies around town. As the years passed it got harder to find a supplier. One extra aggravation was the 5 year Hyrdostatic test you had to have done on the bottle by a certified tester. So I decided it was time to look at some other options. I opted for a standard air compressor since the little baby I needed to keep asleep is now pushing 40 and lives a long way away and my wife has learned to expect almost any kind of noise from the basement and sleeps right through it. So the noise factor was out of the equation and I was tired of driving all over the county to find a source to refill the tank.

At Harbor Freight I found a good looking air brush compressor for \$45 and with a few fittings it was rigged up to my air brush and ready to go in no time.

The upshot is that sometimes tools you've learned to live with can be improved. If you're new to the hobby, get advice and ideas, then begin to build your stock of tools. We can help you make choices if you ask but don't forget to stay open to ALTERNATIVES!

National's Scale Rails could use it. It doesn't have to be fancy just well presented material.

You get points per page or photo with 1 point for Division publications, 2 for a regional and 3 for nationals. Scale drawings earn even more! While you're at it why not turn it into a clinic for presentation at a local meeting or regional convention. That gets you big points too. You can coordinate your work with other folks and split the credit. Your work can even go onto the Internet on our Webpage or the MCR page. There are so many ways to build up enough score for this award that you can't miss. It takes some interest and participation but that's the name of the game with the Achievement Program.

Proposed Amendments to the By-Laws

In accordance with article VII of the By-Laws of Division 3, Mid Central Region, National Model Railroad Association Inc. the following amendments are proposed by the Board of Governors. These amendments are required in order to bring the Division into compliance with the national and region by-laws of the NMRA. They will be published in the September and October *Call Boards* and ratified at the October general meeting.

Current:

II. MEMBERSHIP

A. Any member in good standing (current dues paid) of the NMRA residing in the Third Division (as specified in Article I of the By-Laws of the Mid Central Region) is a member of Division 3. In the event that a member of Division 3 changes his place of residence to a Division contiguous to the territory of Division 3, he may retain his membership in Division 3 by communicating that fact to the Board of Governors of Division 3, and shall remain a member, entitled to all the rights and privileges of Division 3 membership including the right to vote in Division 3 elections and to hold office. Members of the NMRA residing other than above, shall be permitted to participate in Division 3 activities, but may not hold office or vote at Division 3 meetings.

II. MEMBERSHIP

A. Any member in good standing (current dues paid) of the NMRA residing in the Third Division (as specified in Article I of the By-Laws of the Mid Central Region) is a member of Division 3. Any other members of the NMRA shall be permitted to participate in Division 3 activities, but may not hold office or vote at Division 3 meetings.

IV. BOARD OF GOVERNORS

6. Upon the adoption of these By-Laws, the then elected officers of Division 3, Mid Central Region, National Model Railroad Association, an unincorporated association, and predecessor to Division 3, Mid Central Region, National Model Railroad Association, Inc., shall serve as the Board of Governors of said Corporation until the next scheduled elections to take place in April of 1996.

Current:

V. FINANCES

A. No dues or other assessments may be imposed by the Board of Governors without the affirmative vote of 75% of the members eligible to vote attending a regular meeting. Any such proposed dues or assessments shall be duly published in two consecutive issues of the <u>Call Board</u>, the Division 3 paper,

prior to the meeting at which such vote is scheduled. The Division may also accept voluntary donations to finance the business of the Division.

V. FINANCES

A. No dues or other assessments may be imposed by the Board of Governors. The Division may accept voluntary donations to finance the business of the Division.

Current:

V. FINANCES

- D. Funds not required for current expenses shall be invested to obtain maximum interest. Such investments shall be low risk and shall include, but not be limited to, Certificates of Deposit. Withdrawals from the principal sum of the investments shall require the following procedure:
 - 1. Notice of such proposed withdrawal shall be posted in two consecutive issues of the <u>Call</u> Board, prior to a vote.
 - 2. Such withdrawal must be approved by at least two-thirds of the members present at the Division 3 business meeting at which the withdrawal is voted. Failure of any member to receive notice shall not invalidate such a vote, provided that 75% if those attending the meeting received such notice.
 - 3. The actual withdrawal shall require the signature of both the Chief Clerk and one other elected officer.

V. FINANCES

- D. Funds not required for current expenses shall be invested in insured, interest bearing instruments. Withdrawals from the principal sum of the investments shall require the following procedure:
 - 1. Notice of such proposed withdrawal shall be posted in two consecutive issues of the $\underline{\text{Call}}$ $\underline{\text{Board}}$, prior to a vote.
 - 2. Such withdrawal must be approved by at least two-thirds of the members present at the Division 3 business meeting at which the withdrawal is voted. Failure of any member to receive notice shall not invalidate such a vote, provided that 75% if those attending the meeting received such notice.
 - 3. The actual withdrawal shall require the signature of both the Chief Clerk and one other elected officer.

Current:

VII. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- B. A nominating committee consisting of a chairman and at least two others shall be appointed by the Superintendent at least two months prior to the election. One month prior to the election the nominating committee shall announce the nominees, at which time nominations from the floor shall be accepted. There shall be a minimum of two members nominated for each office. The nominating committee shall take charge of the elections, printing and counting of ballots, and the announcement of new officers.
- C. The term of office for elected officers shall commence in the first month following the election and shall continue for two years or until successors are duly elected and appointed. No elected officer shall serve more than two consecutive terms in any one position.

Proposed:

VII. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

B. A nominating committee consisting of a chairman and at least two others shall be appointed by the Superintendent at least two months prior to the election. One month prior to the election the nominating committee shall announce the nominees, at which time nominations from the floor shall be accepted. The nominating committee shall take charge of the elections, printing and counting of ballots, and the announcement of new officers.

C. The term of office for elected officers shall commence in May following the election and shall continue for two years or until successors are duly elected and appointed. No elected officer shall serve more than two consecutive terms in any one position.
