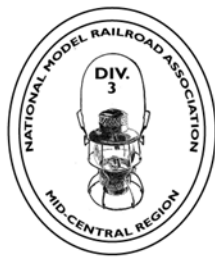
### Board of Governors

First, Railroad Training Day at Carillon Park is right around the corner. If you participated last year in this event, please gather your exhibit and be ready to participate. Gail Yarnall is the lead for this activity and will need to know where and how you can participate. Please sign-up at the next meeting.

We are the hosts for the 2026 MCR Convention. There will only be approximately 6 weeks between Training Day and the start of the convention, and we need everyone's support for this event. I can't emphasize the importance of the convention as it is our opportunity to highlight both the division and the Dayton area. Registration for this event is still

lagging behind.. If you have tried to register and have trouble getting to the registration page simple "click" on the convention logo or the convention briefing on the division's website, "modelraildayton.com". Download the registration package when the offered and a new set of charts will emerge. Please get yourself registered as soon as possible.

The convention will provide over 30 different clinics covering a variety of topics on model railroading and the history or railroading. Our busy schedule through the end of June. It will take a lot of volunteers to accomplish this. Hope we are all up to it:

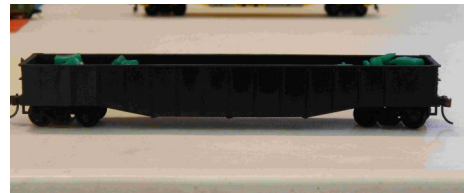
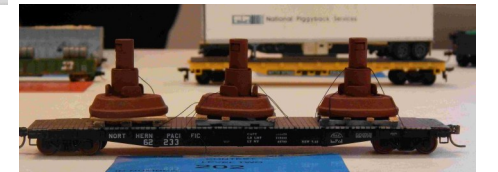
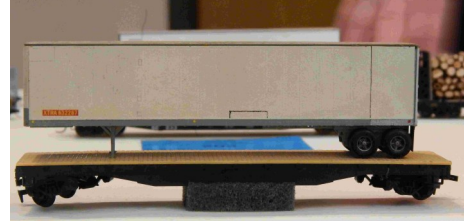
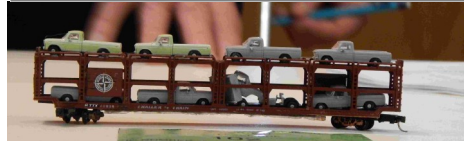

It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of Harry Noble, former Division 3 member, enthusiastic participant in local Dayton Model Railroading events, and good friend, on December 22, at age 88. In addition to his family and his church, Harry loved trains. As an author, under the pen name of Cinder Sam, he wrote train stories for children. In addition,

Harry wrote articles for the various train magazines and eventually earned the Achievement Program Certificate for Author. He was active in the Live Steam Society at Carillon Park, and his photo appeared on their publicity pamphlet operating a steam locomotive. He also participated in our Model Railroad Training Day on at least 2 occasions discussing and setting up some of his vintage

O gauge model trains. And finally, Harry designed and built a log car in both HO and O gauge and was on the schedule to present a clinic on his model at one of our meetings this spring. Harry was always a gentleman, and I treasure the last time I spoke with him at the Springfield Train Show on December 7, just 3 weeks prior to his death. Harry will be missed. May he rest in peace.
